The NISC Aims to Strengthen Situational Awareness and Interoperability across the Nation

The National Information Sharing Consortium (NISC) is pleased to announce that it will soon take on administration and oversight of the Virtual USA® (vUSA) Library. The NISC is working with the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Science and Technology Directorate (S&T) First Responders Group (FRG) to collaborate on other aspects of the vUSA Program as well. The NISC will transition the Virtual Library from a prototype to an operational system based on needs, requirements, and lessons learned from the vUSA pilots and demonstrations that were held by DHS S&T from February 2009 through the present day. The NISC expects to be fully engaged in its governance role by the end of FY 2013. Over time, the NISC intends to play a key leadership role in establishing national situational awareness and information sharing capabilities that benefit public safety, first responder, and emergency management organizations across the nation. In the coming years, that work will expand to include voice and data communications interoperability via converged IP-based networks (like NextGen 911 and FirstNet).

The NISC also plans to deploy additional platforms and technologies that might offer opportunities to bolster program capacity, and will lead efforts toward validating vUSA's infrastructure, requirements, and value to the field of emergency management on programmatic and operational levels. Such efforts will involve soliciting recommendations from representatives within the homeland security, emergency management, and first responder communities to guarantee that vUSA remains a practitioner-driven program.

The NISC is committed to a transition that will enhance the user experience and increase overall vUSA program participation, and will collaborate with S&T to ensure that the transition is as seamless as possible. Plans and progress updates will be communicated regularly over the course of the transition. In the meantime, please contact the NISC at virtualusa@nisconsortium.org with any questions or comments.
